

7th Conference of AOA Announced



AOA President Prof. Takaishi has visited Iran in September 2009 to consult with Iranian Ostomy Society (IOS) on plans of the 7th AOA Conference hosted by IOS in Tehran in 2011. He was warmly welcomed by Dr. Mohammad Vafai, IOS President, Dr. Nanaei, Executive Director for International Relations, and IOS members. Dr. Vafai is a pioneer of colorectal surgery in Iran and he played the major role to form the Society in 2001. IOS is formally registered non-profit organization in Iran.

IOS has recently announced the date, venue and registration form on their website; <u>http://www.iranostomy.org/</u>. <u>The date of the</u> <u>Conference is October 19th to 21st, 2011, and the venue is the Olympic</u> <u>Hotel in outskirt of Tehran.</u>

In his talks with IOS, President expressed his will and expectation

to use the Conference, the first one to be held to the west of Thailand, to expand AOA/IOA links in the Middleeastern nations and NISs nearby, because the IOS is sole association of AOA to the west of India so far, and he found they are well qualified to act as a promoter of ostomy patients activities in the region.

The 6th Congress of the 1-3 October 2010 Borobudur Hotel, Jakarta By Mr. Kong Kin Chai

It was on quite a short notice that I was informed of the Congress but I managed to do an extract to be put up in the program book and the organizers managed to print the extract into the program book.

I arrived in Jakarta at about 3.30 pm Jakarta time and very quickly got onto a taxi to go to the hotel. The journey was however torturously slow as there was a huge traffic jam as I was told by the taxi driver that some people go off work at 4.00 pm.

I arrived at the hotel at about 5.30, a two hour travel instead of the 30 minutes travel as stated in the internet. After settling quickly into the hotel room, there was a dinner organized by Alcare which I attended that night.

Present at the dinner was a few distinguished guests like Professor Shindo, Dr Carlos Pezcoller, Dr Benny, Dr Dieta, Dr Melissa and also Ms Kemala together with some ostomates. After the dinner, there was a sharing which was very informative. One of the issues I spoke on was the skin barrier for young, active ostomates who will perspire a lot especially in some of the hot and humid countries in Asia.

During the first day of the Congress, Dr Pezcoller talked about treatment of stoma complications. After the talk, I managed to speak to dr Pezcoller and told him that he might have missed mentioning about stoma revision especially for child illeostomate. He agreed that the pathology of ostomates should be looked into.

The Congress went well with the doctors and nurses addressing the issues of stoma care in the Asian countries. The more advanced countries felt that it is more efficient to discharge the patients as soon as possible. A week's stay in hospital was felt enough for the new ostomates to be in hospital.

The Congress was informative but I felt the second motive of interacting with the ostomates in Indonesia and also the nurses and doctors was equally important. I spoke to Dr Dieta and Dr Melissa to help the ostomates whenever possible. Malaysia also sent some nurses there and I met Ms Ani Maryani of Indonesia who is the president of InETNA. I suggested that the nurses of both Malaysia and Indonesia work together with the ostomate society.

Of course, the meeting with the ostomates was very cordial and Ms Kemala, whom I know from the AOA Conference in Japan, was excellent in introducing the ostomates there. Incidentally, Ms Kemala is also the President of the InOA. I got to know of one Mr Arifin Iskandar, an ostomate, who shared with me some of the problems faced by the ostomates in Indonesia. Some are very poor and they only wear a pouch with no base plate. Supplies of the bags come from Australia mostly. InOA is under the control of Yayasan Kanker Indonesia (Indonesian Cancer Fund).

When 3 October came, we had to say goodbye and happy to say, I did not have to face the traffic jam on my home.

The Ostomates India, a self-help group of ostomates dedicated to the rehabilitation of ostomy patients, is an association that has more than 10,000 members and 12 branches in the country. The association conducts a free ostomy check-up from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. on first Saturdays of every month at the head office at Bangalore. Many new ostomates come for the free ostomy check up for the guidance to know how to manage the stoma. This also gives an opportunity to meet other ostomates to exchange views.

The association was established 25 years ago at the Kidwai Institute of Oncology here with an aim to helping ostomates lead a normal life by providing bags and other equipment to the poor and needy patients.

This is an ongoing process and many ostomates from other cities in South India use this opportunity. We hope that through this AOA newsletter, this message is spread for the benefit of ostomates not only of India but also of the whole Asian RegionOstomates

<u>News from KOA</u> By Mr. Bong Kyu Chun

I am glad to write it to you. first of all, I would like to introduce myself. I am the executive director since last April, an ostomate 2003, was born 1949, majored in mechanical engineering but now retired.

KOA held the 12th Annual Seminar for Ostomates on the 15th of October sponsored by a hospital which is famous for colorectal clinic in Korea. About 60 members attended and had a good time. This seminar we invited a doctor majored in "male sexology", even though almost of us have some problems in it, but hardly ask to others. After his speech, we had the Q&A time and talked freely about the topic. It is very instructive and profitable time. Also we heard chorus and saw magic done by one of our member, an ileostomate.

KOA is now struggling against the government for "purchasing pouches". Since September. 2005, government has given us the benefit in purchasing pouches as 5% on our expense, with 95% government subsidy. But this law is limited for only 5 years after surgical operation of colorectal cancer. After the 5 years is finished, many beneficiaries must pay 30-60%, The rate is different by the hospital grade which we use. Due to this development, KOA protested that term will not be limited to 5 years or the rate of our expense will be down to 10 - 20%.



Do you have a 20/40 Focus Group Desk already?

The 20/40 Focus Group Desk is a structured set-up of young volunteer ostomates coming from the countries and regions of Asia. They establish themselves as a satellite group with its own rules and regulations that is in constant communication with the 20/40 Focus Asian representative. The desk will fall under the umbrella of the present ostomy association of the particular country. The reason behind forming a satellite desk is decentralization. It can propose activities other than the set guidelines proposed by the 20/40 Asian representative. In this way, the activities are acted upon and implemented according to one's cultural inclinations and background.



The main preoccupation of the Focus Group desk is to gather young committed ostomates who can promote ostomy advocacy. They gather for group sharings, medical missions and just plain and fun time enjoying each other's company. The connotation of the Desk is symbolic. It can literally mean a table to represent an office. If this is not possible due to constraints of meeting place, it may also mean a contact person who will facilitate the activities of the Focus Group Desk.
